Funding Cut for California Welcome Center– EDH Chamber Steps up with Assist from Town Center

El Dorado Hills, CA —Earlier this year, the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors cut all tourism funding, which included support for the El Dorado Hills California Welcome Center (CWC). As a result, the CWC closed in July. Since then, the El Dorado Hills Chamber of Commerce has stepped in to operate a scaled-down welcome center using its own staff and resources in order to continue serving visitors and the community. "The CWC draws hundreds of visitors per month," says Chamber President & CEO Debbie Manning, "and these visitors support local businesses when they fill up their tanks, shop and dine here. They're also looking for the best kept secrets and things to do in El Dorado County. They're appreciative of the many referrals we provide!"
